

IMMUNIZATION and HEALTH REQUIREMENTS STATEMENT

I acknowledge by signing this document that I have been informed and am aware that the following Kansas health items are required for any student enrolled in a public school.

K.S.A. 72-6262 requires every pupil enrolling in any public/private school present proof from a physician or local health department that the pupil has received such tests and vaccinations as are deemed necessary by state law. Required vaccines include the following:

DTaP/DT/Tdap (diphtheria,tetanus,pertussis) - **REQUIRED PK-12, BOOSTER REQUIRED 7-12** IPV (polio) - **REQUIRED PK-12** MMR (measles,mumps,rubella) - **REQUIRED PK-12** Varicella (chicken pox) - **REQUIRED PK-12 OR PHYSICIAN DOCUMENTATION OF ILLNESS** Hepatitis A - **REQUIRED PK-12** Hepatitis B - **REQUIRED PK-12** Hib (haemophilus influenza type B) - **REQUIRED PK ONLY** Pneumococcal - **REQUIRED PK ONLY** Meningococcal - **REQUIRED FOR 7-12**

K.S.A. 72-9934 requires proof of identity in the form of a state issued birth certificate. Hospital copies cannot be accepted. After 90 days, schools are required to notify authorities if a birth certificate has not been turned in.

K.S.A. 72-6267 requires that any child under the age of nine or entering a Kansas school for the first time receive a health assessment completed by a licensed provider or local health department within the last 12 months.

In USD 402, the Kansas health requirements for enrollment must be complete and provided to the school in order to avoid exclusion from school according to the dates listed below:

- October 1st if enrolled and admitted on or before the 1st day of school
- Students who enroll/start after the 1st day of the current school year have 30 days from their start date to provide the required documentation

Students without the required documentation will not be allowed to attend school after the above dates until all items are turned in.

I understand as a parent/guardian it is my duty to turn in all required documents. I also understand that I have the right to a hearing with a written request.
